

## Sustainable development charter

This charter commits the Organisation Committee of the 2020RWC to organise an event that complies with the existing criteria of any Grands Evénements Sportifs Internationaux (GESI).

### Sustainable event management

The 2020RWC have drawn up a sustainability strategy that can be broken down into 5 strategic schemes:

- ⇒ Venues and infrastructure
- ⇒ Supply and management of natural resources
- ⇒ Mobility
- ⇒ Societal responsibility
- ⇒ Climate

Key performance indicators are implemented for each item of the five schemes in order to allow for continuous monitoring.



#### Venues and infrastructure

The use of existing infrastructure is favoured. When temporary infrastructure is needed, sustainability is at the centre of focus.



#### Supply and management of natural resources

The 2020RWC aim to strengthen the supply, recycling and reuse of resources chains in order to leave a positive social, environmental and economical impact locally.

Quality and responsible food is served.

Reduction and recovery of waste are organised to encourage a « zero waste » philosophy.

The 2020RWC aim to leave a positive impact on biodiversity, to preserve the soils and to avoid any waste of water.



#### Mobility

The 2020RWC provide a multimodal mobility plan that prioritises public transport, rail freight, zero emission vehicles, cycling lanes and pedestrian ways.

In principle, all venues are accessible to all, including people with disabilities.



### **Societal responsibilities**

The 2020RWC integrate the principles of equality, inclusivity, diversity and complementarity while promoting health and fitness for all.



### **Climate**

The 2020RWC implement a « low carbon » strategy, including reduction and compensation actions.
